3,041 people died or disappeared in the Mediterannean in 2023: one of the worst years on record. To combat this 'Sea Cemetery' in our very own backyard, YMCA Malta co-signed an activist statement urging the Maltese and EU authorities to stop collaborating with corrupt actors in North Africa who are known for human rights violations, and to promptly and humanely aid those in distress at sea, as well as the organisations helping them.

A protest on February 18th at Gardjola Gardens helped solidify the intention of this joint statement. We endorsed it as one of Malta's leading voices on social justice issues and will continue to endorse such events until justice has been done for these voiceless migrants.







Human Library

The concept of a 'Human Library' was born in Denmark in 2000 and has since spread to over 70 countries around the globe – including Malta. Attendants who visit the 'Library' have an unmissable opportunity to talk to people from all walks of life, often on socially taboo topics. The goal is simple: spread human kindness and break deeply ingrained stigmas.

Last week we proudly presented at the Junior College for this year's edition. Young people had the opportunity to learn more about the *'Life of a Homeless Teenager'* by hearing our beloved former service-user Louise Pace talk about her experiences as a homeless youth. Raising awareness face-to-face in this manner is a deeply powerful and enriching experience.

WARNING: Awesome Podcasts on the Way

Our 2022 research study <u>'The Culture of Youths in Malta'</u> confirmed that 54% of Maltese youth vote of their own free will. We wanted to elaborate on this important statistic and give our young people a platform and a voice in their *own* future.

We have been producing a series of podcasts as part of our participation in the 'My Voice to Europe' project. These audio awareness pieces raise social concerns directly from young people before the upcoming MEP EU Elections in June this year. 
Author Zsolt Bernath has walked the French Way – the almost 900-km route from the


